The Supervisory Board

The main role of the Supervisory Board is to supervise the management bodies and ensure that the Executive Board is properly managed. It is assisted by 3 ad hoc committees. The Supervisory Board has 18 members, divided into 4 colleges:

Audit and Finance Committee

This committee is responsible for assisting the Supervisory Board and facilitating its decision-making in the following areas: monitoring financial strategy; accounts and financial information; annual budget and budget monitoring; investment projects; internal control and risk prevention.

The Remuneration Committee

This committee is responsible for issuing opinions and recommendations to the Supervisory Board on: the remuneration of members of the Executive Board; the remuneration and granting of exceptional bonuses for the positions of directors and those defined by its operating charter; the remuneration and profit-sharing policy for Institut Curie staff; the policy for compensating members of the Scientific Advisory Board; the policy for reimbursing expenses.

The Ethics Committee

This committee is responsible for defining and maintaining the Institut Curie's ethical values. It reports to the Supervisory Board on all its work. Its work is supported by the Ethics Commission for the medical care of patients and their families, the Animal Experimentation Ethics Committee (CEEA) and the Institutional Ethics Commission.

The Scientific Advisory Board

The Scientific Advisory Board is made up of international experts - particularly in the field of cancer research - from outside the Institut Curie. Its role is to provide strategic advice on the Institute's major orientations and programmes of activities.

The Research Centre

With an international reputation, the Research Centre brings together 88 scientific teams whose work aims to gain a better understanding of how living organisms function. The Director of the Research Centre is appointed by the Executive Board and reports directly to it. He attends the Executive Board meetings.

The hospital complex

Equipped with state-of-the-art facilities, the hospital complex treats all cancers, including the rarest. It is a benchmark in the treatment of breast and ophthalmological tumours, sarcomas, thoracic cancers and paediatric tumours. The director of the hospital complex is elected every 5 years by the Executive Board. Since 1 September 2021, it has been headed by Professor Steven Le Gouill.

The Director of the hospital complex is appointed by the Executive Board and reports directly to it. He attends Executive Board meetings.

He is supported by a CoDIr made up of the Deputy Director Anne-Claire de Reboul, the Site Directors for Paris, Pre Nathalie Cassoux, for Saint-Cloud, Dr Laurence Bozec and for Orsay, Dr Rémi Dendale, and the Director of Nursing, Sabine Belorgey.

Head office

The Head Office is the one of the three entities that ensures the coherence of the Institut Curie's different activities in the service of its establishment project. As such, it :

- Manages and coordinates shared services
- Guarantees the protection and enhancement of tangible and intangible heritage
- Ensures compliance of activities
- Guarantees the provision of resources specific to Headquarters and essential to the Institut Curie's economic equilibrium
- Guarantees the Institut Curie's financial reporting
- Ensures that the decisions of the relevant governance bodies are implemented

Generally speaking, it provides expertise, encourages project-based management and supports all activities linked to the hospital complex and the Research Centre.
