



## Potential Activities for Patient Participation in Clinical Trials

Activities for Patient Participation	Description
<b>Formulating the research question</b>	Patients' perspectives on relevant health issues and research questions
<b>Determination of outcomes</b>	Prioritise outcomes that matter most to patients
<b>Designing/ Reviewing Protocols</b>	Protocols accessible to participants
<b>Co-creation of materials</b>	Information and consent materials, ensuring they are understandable and meet patients' needs.
<b>Recruitment and retention</b>	Help develop strategies to recruit and retain participants and act as ambassadors for the trial in the community.
<b>Participation in ethics committees</b>	Provide the patient's perspective on risk-benefit decisions.
<b>Creation of tailoring interventions</b>	Interventions for specific populations, creation of materials and tools, etc.
<b>Collaboration on dissemination</b>	Participate in the dissemination of trial results, helping to communicate results in a way that is understandable to other patients and the public.
<b>Impact of results</b>	How trial results affect patients and their care, and help identify areas for future research
<b>Evaluation</b>	Evaluate participants' experiences during the clinical trial, contributing to improvements for future studies
